

The meetings will be every other Monday. We will break just before Thanksgiving and will resume in January 20205.



## Evangelization

This is the 2nd edition since the Eucharist Congress in July - have you had a chance to watch any of the videos from the Conference? I have watched several: Bishop Barron, Jonathon Roumie, Chris Stefanik, Monsignor James Shea, and Gloria Purvis so far and I honestly can't tell you which is my favorite. I will say that I think Chris S and Fr. Mike were tied for energy levels, but all who spoke seemed to be so filled with the Spirit, I was moved so much with each one! St Mary Magdalene has a special Eucharist Revival page with links to all the full speeches from the Congress. There are also other links and resources on that page; the link is at the bottom of this page or you can use the QR code to go to our page.

The sending forth mission of the Congress was "Walk with one," meaning, who can you pray for, be a witness to, invite to mass or adoration this next year. Have you picked your one? I have prayerfully been discerning this and I have chosen my one. It is someone that has been on my heart my whole life - one of those family members that just tugs at me. It isn't that I had given up hope for them, I just had set aside my efforts. So this year, I am FOCUSING my efforts and my prayers and I will be directly witnessing in LOVE to this person even if it makes them uncomfortable and makes me uncomfortable at times, in hopes that there will finally be fruit. But, we all have to remember - the work is up to us, and the fruit is up to God.

If you haven't watched Gloria Purvis' testimony from the Eucharist Congress yet - I encourage you to do so this week (it's linked out from our website). I think I relate to it because she had a connection to God as a young child, a gift of faith as I did. She also had a conversion to Catholicism that her family didn't follow, which I can also relate to. What I most appreciated was the truth she spoke about **UNITY**. There is so much INFIGHTING within the church today, about how people vote, how people worship...She threw DOWN to speak against the divisive language we hear so much about today. She called us back to unity remembering that *no matter what: JESUS is always on the throne;* reminding us we are CATHOLIC FIRST.

as He and the Father are ONE.




#### PENITENTIAL ACT

#### SECOND READING

Eph 5: 21-32







### HYMN SPOTLIGHT

"Look Beyond" (continued)

In our final weekend this season singing Look Beyond, we add two verses to coincide with today's Gospel. Earlier we saw how verses 1-3 depicted the crowd of Jesus' followers asking for a sign to prove he is sent by the Father, followed by his teaching that "the bread I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." (Jn 6:51) Verses 4 and 5 portray these followers murmuring amongst themselves about their difficulty accepting Jesus' claim, resulting in their subsequent decision to abandon him. This prompts Jesus to ask the Twelve if they also intend to leave, to which they respond "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." (Jn 6:68)

Our John 6 study may have concluded, but we'll continue to examine the ways our hymns and songs intersect with the liturgy and sacred Scripture.




